Mountain railways



Climb the peaks of the Kitzbühel Alps in a wheelchair with the mountain railways and the Kitzbüheler Alpen Summercard (www.sommer-card.at). Access to the gondolas is barrier-free or possible with a lift. The cable car staff will be happy to help you get into the gondola. Freedom of movement on the mountain is limited - but the views are gigantic!

Chair Lift Buchensteinwand St. Jakob in Haus:

Access by car to get off at the station is possible. The wheelchair is transported with another chair. Platform in Jakobskreuz accessible by elevator. Toilet in Jakobskreuz barrier-free.

Hartkaiserbahn Ellmau:

Access by car to get off at the station is possible.

Hornbahn Kitzbühel:

Access by car to get out possible. Or park at the P1 parking lot (disabled parking spaces available), then a small pitch to the gondola entrance.

Excursion tips - in the area:

Nature reserve Kaiserbach valley in Gasteig/Kirchdorf

The toll road into the Kaiserbach valley allows people with disabilities to see the bizarre, rugged rock faces of the Wilder Kaiser. From Griesenau/Kirchdorf, the well-developed paid road leads past the mountaineers' memorial chapel, Fischbachalm, mountain pine distillery to the Griesner Alm.

Wilder Käser show dairy Gasteig / Kirchdorf

Krimml Waterfalls and WaterWonderWorld

Grossglockner High Alpine Road

The famous Alpine road takes you to the highest mountain in Austria, the Großglockner (3,798m). Almost all viewing points and parking or rest areas can be reached by vehicle. www.grossglockner.at

Disabled toilets: Ferleiten ticket office, Haus Alpine Naturschau, Kaiser-Franz-Josefs-Höhe Barrier-free refreshment options: Glocknerhaus, panoramic restaurant Kaiser-Franz-Josef-Höhe, bistros in Haus Alpine, Nature show and at the Hochtor.

Excursion tips - Innsbruck:

The most famous landmark of the state capital of Tyrol is the Golden Roof in the Gothic old town. A few streets behind it is St. Jacob's Cathedral. Stroll along Maria-Theresien-Street to the Triumph Gate. Golden Roof Museum

Built as the residence of the Tyrolean sovereigns. The magnificent dungeon with the 2657 gold-plated copper shingles was added by Emperor Maximilian I. Permanent exhibition on Emperor Maximilian I and the late Middle Ages in Tyrol. www.goldenes-dachl.at

Imperial Palace

Built in the late Gothic style under Archduke Sigmund and Emperor Maximilian I, redesigned under Empress Maria Theresia, state hall, chapel, showrooms. www.hofburg-innsbruck.at



Entrance for wheelchair users in the Great Castle Courtyard (please ring the bell). At the first staircase there is a stair lift, then a lift to the exhibition rooms. Disabled toilets on the ground floor and second floor.

Court Church

Built 1555-65, most important German imperial tomb (pseudo grave of Maximilian I) surrounded by 28 life-size bronze figures. www.tiroler-landesmuseen.at

Tyrolean Folk Art Museum

The largest painted work of art in Tyrol, the giant circular painting www.tiroler-landesmuseen.at All areas are accessible by wheelchair, there is a wheelchair accessible toilet and a rental wheelchair







Excursion tips - Salzburg:

The silhouette of the fortress, cathedral and church towers of the baroque city is so beautiful that it has long been a UNESCO World Heritage Site. When strolling through the old town you will discover the Getreidegasse, the cathedral, the residence, the glockenspiel, Mozart's birthplace, the horse trough, the St. Peter's monastery, the famous festival halls and, across the river, the Mirabell Gardens and Mirabell Palace with its marble hall - of course always in view of the Hohensalzburg Fortress. www.salzburg.info/en/salzburg/barrier-free

The DomQuartier Salzburg includes the historical center of the political and ecclesiastical power of the Salzburg prince-archbishops.
